Performance Notes

Gray Faces is notated in two staves, one for pitch, and one for multiphonic fingerings. For ease of reading, the multiphonic fingerings of the first 35 measures include all pertinent rhythmic information (i.e. they are notated with stems and beams), so that the performer does not need to look away from the fingerings any more than is absolutely necessary. During these measures, non-multiphonics appear in the fingering staff as empty stems. As of measure 36, multiphonic fingerings are notated traditionally.

Grace-notes should be played as fast as possible. The length of any grace-note figure should not take away any time from the preceding or following material; rather, metrical time (i.e. counting) should pause until the grace-note figure has completed. For example, a measure of 2/4 containing grace-notes should last two beats plus the length of time taken up by the grace-notes.

The following dynamic figure reoccurs throughout. The crescendo should end abruptly, when the tongue touches the reed. The general effect should be similar to a backward recording.
